Hello fellow paddlers and outdoor enthusiasts,

2009 saw a busy year for Canoe Kayak New Brunswick (CKNB) and 2010 is promising to be even busier. Enclosed are activities that our members partook in and events coming up for this season.

- In May 2009 we had the Atlantic Paddling Symposium held at Camp Glenburn in NB. This year CKNB is proud to again be a sponsor of the symposium. Further down is the full poster explaining all. It will take place at Lake Charlotte, NS. We encourage **all** paddlers to partake in this great event.

- CKNB offered 39 Paddling Courses with 283 participants in 2009. We hope to increase the number of courses offered as more instructors come on board and as an increasing number of people join our sport with safety in mind.

CKNB is in the process of developing a number of paddling courses exclusive to NB: Basic Canoeing, Lake Water Tripping and River Tripping, courses designed for schools and the Big Canoe Program.

- CKNB participated as one of the presenters at the NB Trails AGM with a presentation on the CKNB Project, the Ancient Native Portage Trails of NB. Again our website has further information.

- The annual instructor weekend was another success, held in September 2009, on the beautiful Miramichi. The discipline of canoe poling was the main theme this year. Plans are underway for the 2010 instruct the instructor weekend.

- CKNB is involved in a national committee working on a new canoe program, "**Big Canoe paddling**". We are currently having a 26 foot "big canoe" built. Nationally accredited courses will be offered, initially for instructors, then out to the paddling public.

- CKNB has created a committee to work on the development of a Canoe/Kayak Small Craft Museum. Talks are underway with the Canadian Canoe Museum (CCM), Peterborough, Ontario, to work in alliance with this national body. www.canoemuseum.ca

- CKNB is hosting a number of winter workshop seminars: Paddling in Labrador, Tips for Extended Remote Expeditions, Modern Canoe Design, PowerPoint presentation: Faces of Canoeing, Canoe Paddle Construction, etc. Below is a list of workshops offered at this time. **All are invited**.
